
Key Question: What might a Hindu learn from celebrating Diwali?

Dharm a	Religious duty.
Diety	A god or a goddess.
Divas	Small oil lamps used for decoration to remind people of the importance of light.





Traditionally, Vishna has had 10 previous avatars. Rama is one of Vishnu's avatars.

## Religious Story/Religious Beliefs:

The story of Rama and Sita reminds Hindus that good triumphs over evil.

In the story, Rama, Sita and Hanuman represent goodness and light. Ravana represents darkness and evil.

It is Rama's role to destroy evil.

The story is celebrated at Diwali – celebrating good overcoming evil and light overcoming darkness.

Belief: Hindus believe in one god- Brahman

who is made up of 3 parts:-

Brahma - creates the universe,

Vishna - protects and preserves the universe

**Shiva** - destroys the universe.
