Vocabulary you will learn:	
Baptism	A ritual using water to show belonging to the Christian faith.
Sacrament	A special religious ceremony where Christians believe God is present.
Rite of passage	A ceremony that marks an important stage in a person's life.
Confirmation	A ceremony where Christians make a personal choice to follow Jesus.
Marriage	A service where two people promise to love and stay faithful to one another.
Funeral	A service to remember a person's life and commend them into God's care.



Religious Story/Religious Beliefs:

Christians believe that Jesus was baptised in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. This shows the importance of baptism as a way of beginning a new life with God.

They also believe in Jesus' death and resurrection, which gives hope of eternal life – a belief often reflected in funeral services.

The Bible teaches that God is with people at every stage of life, and Christians mark these turning points to show their faith, commitment, and trust in God's promises.

Key facts about Christianity:

Holy book: The Bible

Place of Worship: Church

Belief: Christians believe in one God and that Jesus is the Son of God, who died and rose again.

Special Day: Sunday (the day of Jesus' resurrection, when Christians gather for worship).
