## Religious Story/Religious Beliefs:

Muslims believe that completing Hajj, a pilgrimage to Mecca, is one of the most important acts of faith. During Hajj, they perform rituals like walking around the Ka'ba, standing on Mount Arafat, and praying together, showing unity and devotion to Allah.

The journey is not only about travel but also about self-reflection, forgiveness, and strengthening one's faith. Muslims feel part of a global community (the Ummah) because millions of people from all over the world are performing Hajj together.

Even if someone cannot physically make the pilgrimage, they can still be rewarded by Allah if their intention is pure. This shows that what matters is the heart and effort, not just the actions.
