Who was Boudicca?



Boudicca was the queen of the Iceni tribe in Britain. She became angry when the Romans treated her people unfairly and took their land. In 60 AD, she led a rebellion against the Romans. Boudicca and her army attacked several Roman towns, including London. At first, they were successful, but the Romans fought back. Eventually, Boudicca was defeated. Today, she is remembered as a brave leader who stood up for her people.
