

## ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY

<b>countries</b>	Big areas of land where people live. The world is made up of many countries.
<b>capital cities</b>	The most important city in a country, where the government works.
<b>continent</b>	A very large area of land made up of many countries
<b>forecast</b>	A guess about what the weather will be like soon.
<b>Symbol</b>	Pictures or signs that stand for something else (a picture to represent the weather).
<b>locate</b>	To find where something is.
<b>surrounding</b>	The area around something.

## Key Concepts

The <b>UK</b> is located in the continent of <b>Europe</b> .
The <b>UK</b> is made up of <b>four countries</b> . They are <b>Scotland, England, Northern Ireland and Wales</b>
The <b>capital</b> of the <b>UK</b> is <b>London</b> .
The <b>capital</b> of <b>England</b> is <b>London</b> . The <b>capital</b> of <b>Scotland</b> is <b>Edinburgh</b> . The <b>capital</b> of <b>Wales</b> is <b>Cardiff</b> The <b>capital</b> of <b>Northern Ireland</b> is <b>Belfast</b> .
The UK is surrounded by the <b>North Sea, Irish Sea, English Channel and Atlantic Ocean</b> .
<b>Landmarks</b> are famous or important places that people can visit or use to help them know where they are.
<b>North, East, South and West</b> are the four main compass directions.
