

Year 2

Summer (1st half)

English

- **Phonics:** We will have a daily phonics sessions, focusing on Phase 6 words, reading and writing suffixes and long words.
- **Reading:** We will have a guided reading session each day. Sessions will include reading related activities with each child reading to an adult at least twice a week.
- **Story as a Theme:** We will read and retell a variety of stories, traditional and fairy tales before writing our own set at the seaside.
- **Poems on a Theme:** We will read and recite a variety of poems about the seaside. We will then work towards writing our own seaside poem.
- **Explanations:** We will read and learn about the structure and features of explanation texts before writing our own.
- Handwriting: Continuing to learn handwriting joins.

Science

- Identify the properties of materials
- Identify and compare the suitability of materials through conducting experiment
- Find out how solid shapes made from some materials an be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching
- Learn that some materials are found naturally; others have to be made
- Record predictions, observations and findings of experiments.

Maths

- **Time**—Tell the time to 5 minutes; know the number of minutes in an hour and hours in a day; compare and sequence intervals of time.
- Multiplication and Division—Show multiplication can be done in any order; recall and use multiplication and division facts for 2x, 5x and 10x tables; solve problems
- Statistics—Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and tables; ask and answer questions about totalling and comparing categorical data
- Measurement—Estimate and measure mass (g/kg); measure length and height (cm/m); compare and order measurements.
- **Sorting**—Compare and sort common 2D and 3D shapes and everyday objects; compare and sort numbers according to their properties.

History

- Recognise the distinction between past and present in their own and other people's lives
- Identify differences and similarities between the seaside now and in Victorian times
- Explore artefacts from Victorian times
- Show that they understand about the past in different ways, e.g. speaking, role play, writing

• Explore seaside inspire artwork created in a range of mediums
