Welcome

KNSTE is a School Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) provider who works closely with Shaw Education Trust and a partnership of over 120 schools to offer high quality teacher education. Our SCITT partnership comprises of primary, special and middle schools and a mixture of large and small, urban and rural, faith schools, local authority and academy settings. Ours is an innovative course which is available either as a one-year full time course or two-year part time course.

In 2023, we were recognised as continuing to be an 'outstanding' provider by Ofsted. They stated that, "leaders' vision of 'reaching for excellence' is fully recognised through this high-quality initial teacher education course. The programme provides trainees with the best possible start to their professional careers". On successful completion of all of our courses you will gain Qualified Teacher Status (QTS). On the QTS & PGCE route you will also gain a Sheffield Hallam Postgraduate Certificate of Education.

Where are we based?

KNSTE is based at The Shaw Education Trust Learning Hub in Kidsgrove (ST7 4DL) on the site of Kidsgrove Secondary School. Our Learning Hub is a designated space for our trainee teachers to attend taught sessions in a classroom environment.

Our schools are predominately located in Stoke-on-Trent and across Staffordshire but we do have schools in the surrounding counties - Cheshire, Shropshire and Derbyshire.

More about our Initial Teacher Training and Education (ITTE) Programme

Structure of our ITTE Programme

We start our course at the end of August and spend some time introducing you to our programme so that you can benefit from being in school for the first week of the new academic year. KNSTE are very fortunate to have a supportive partnership of schools and during the course we hold a variety of sessions in a range of these schools which enables you to gain from the expertise of a variety of experienced teacher colleagues. Colleagues on the full-time route spend 3 days in school and 2 days at our Learning Hub. We do also offer a two-year part time route and further details can be found on the next page. Towards the end of January, you complete your time in Placement 1 and return to the Learning Hub for two weeks of the programme. During this time we focus on a wider range of subjects and professional capabilities. In your Placement 2, the amount of teaching time in school increases. You are supported throughout the placements by one Lead Mentor (LM) and one General Mentor (GM) from each of your placement schools.

What qualifications will you achieve?

Upon successful completion of all of our programmes, you will gain QTS (Qualified Teacher Status). If you are on the QTS & PGCE route, you will gain QTS together with a Sheffield Hallam University PGCE (Post Graduate Certificate of Education) award worth 60 Master's Level credits. You are assessed through written assignments, presentations and enquiry tasks.

Our Specialisms

In addition to the PGCE and QTS Awards, KNSTE offers recognition of your subject or phase specialisms. These include:

- Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)
- Early Years
- Primary through the lens of:
 - English and Performing Arts
 - Geography and History
 - Art and Design
 - Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)
 - Physical Education (PE)
 - Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)



Alongside your specialisms, you will benefit from additional specialist qualifications including, Philosophy for Children, Prevent and also Understanding the Emotional Wellbeing & Mental Health of Children and Young People.

Two Year Part Time Programme

KNSTE is proud to offer a two year part time route for all its primary courses. It is a rigorous and demanding programme, and colleagues who benefit from this option need to be highly organised. The flexible programme offers the opportunity to combine your commitment to the programme with other aspects of your life.




How does it work?

In Year 1 you will benefit from blocks of core, professional and subject knowledge sessions and blocks of school experience. These will be on a Thursday and Friday. The proportion of time that you spend in school will increase in the Summer Term of Year 1, but will not exceed two days. The course runs from the end of August through until the end of the school year (towards the end of July) and you will be placed in one school throughout the year. During your second year you will spend three days per week with us, during the Autumn and Spring Terms, two of these will be school based (Wednesday and Thursday) and Fridays will be SCITT based. In the Summer Term of Year 2 you will then need to commit to spending 9 weeks full time in your second placement school. The reason for being full-time during your final term of Year 2 is so that you can assure yourself and ourselves that you can sustain the demands of full-time teaching. This will enhance your employability as well as develop your passion for the profession. You can opt to complete your Early Career Teacher programme on a part-time basis following your successful achievement of your ITTE course.



QTS & PGCE or QTS Only

Alongside our QTS & PGCE route, we also offer a QTS only pathway to teaching. A comparison of the two options below may help you in making the decision about which route might be the best for you.

KNSTE Placements

Below is an approximate map of our partnership schools and the area that we work within. Our partnership of schools are predominantly within Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire but we also provide placements in the Cheshire, Shropshire, Derbyshire and South Staffordshire areas.





We take into consideration transport, travel time, care commitments and children/family in schools to find the most suitable placement school for you.

What are the tuition fees?

If you are on a postgraduate Initial Teacher Training course which is not salaried, you will have to pay tuition fees.

Tuition fees vary depending on the course and the provider.

Anticipated fees for the KNSTE courses for 2026-27 are:

- £9,535 for the full-time programme
- £8,535 for QTS only route.
- £6,500 for each year of the flexible route programme commencing in 2026.
- £6,500 + £5,500 for the flexible QTS only route programme commencing in 2026.



You may be eligible for a tuition fee loan to cover the cost of tuition fees charged. This is available through <u>Student Finance England</u>

Assessment Only Route (AO)

The AO route is intended for very experienced graduate teachers without QTS. Applicants will have a wealth of prior teaching experience. Many will be currently employed as unqualified teachers or Higher Level Teaching Assistants (HLTAs). This experience will include responsibility for planning, teaching and assessment of whole classes of fifteen or pupils or more during the last 2-3 years prior to the commencement of the 12 week assessment period. This experience should be gained across a minimum of two different settings. Applicants must have been responsible for teaching and planning in both schools.

Assessment within a Special School, Independent School or Secondary School Setting

We are pleased to offer the opportunity to be assessed in a special school, independent school or secondary school setting. We must assure ourselves that all applicants have the capacity to teach across the full ability range for the age groups for which they are to be assessed. Additionally, we will assure ourselves that applicants have the capability to teach whole classes. Often this can best be evidenced through a second school placement. We are happy to help to facilitate such placements. We welcome individual discussions so that we can enable applicants to secure appropriate pre-assessment evidence.



How to apply

We very much hope that you will be excited to apply to train to teach with us! We recommend an early application.



All applications should be made through the DfE website.

You need the following qualifications or equivalents:

- Achievement of at least a 2:2 honours degree. In highly exceptional and very occasional circumstances, an application with a Third Class degree could be considered.
- Passes at GCSE in English Language, Science and Mathematics at grade C/4 or above

If you do not yet have a GCSE Grade C/4 or above or recognised equivalence, then please get in touch and we can discuss equivalency options with you.
