Students will learn the final solo set dance in the style of Richard Alston and will begin to develop phrases for the Component One quartet performance. Technique classes will revisit the Cunningham technique in support of the solo set dance. Appreciation will complete Kelly influences in preparation for the associated set work Singin' in the Rain and will introduce the contextual training/influences of the set practitioner for Rambert: C. Bruce.	This second unit will revise each solo performance learned for Component One (Robbins, Bruce and Alston) of which will be performed for assessment for the Trial 1 examination. Students will co-devise the first 1:30 minutes of the quartet performance piece for formative assessment at the end of the unit.
