



Leave For Exceptional Circumstances Term Time

The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 make it clear that Head Teachers may not grant *any* leave during term time unless there are 'Exceptional Circumstances'. The amendments give parents/carers no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time.

Please note:

- This form can only be completed by the parent/carer with whom the student resides.
- You will be informed in writing of the decision that has been made with regard to the request.
- The school term dates are available on the website well in advance of each academic year.

Taking your child out of Knutsford Academy without permission, *may* result in the school requesting the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Penalty Notices may be issued for

Term time leave: Penalty Notice fines may be issued for term time leave of 5 or more days (10 sessions) in a 10-week period.

However, school retain the discretion to request a Penalty Notice before the threshold is met. For example, where parents/carers are deliberately avoiding the national threshold by taking several term time holidays below the threshold.

Per Parent/Per Child

Penalty Notice fines will continue to be issued per parent/carer per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent/carer receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence	Second Offence
<p>The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular school attendance the fine will be charged at:</p> <p>£160 per parent/carer, per child if paid within 28 days of the issue, reducing to £80 per parent/carer, per child if paid within 21 days.</p> <p>(Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)</p>	<p>Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice to the same parent/carer for the same pupil within 3 years of the first penalty notice, for either term time leave or irregular attendance the second penalty notice will be charged at:</p> <p>£160 if paid within 28 days. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)</p>

Third Offence

On the third time that an offence is committed within 3 years of the first penalty notice for either a term time leave or irregular attendance a penalty notice will not be issued.

The Local Authority may place the matter before the court. The Magistrates may impose a fine up to £2500.

The case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000 or legal proceedings under Section 444 (1a) can include a fine of up to £2500.

There is no right of appeal by parents against a penalty notice.
