Britain: health & the people

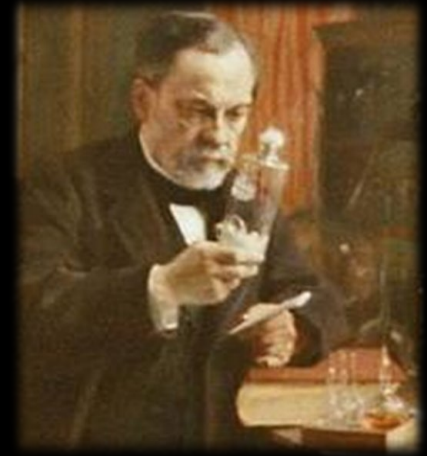
This is an opportunity to study a wide range of past eras, from the Middle Ages to the twentieth century, using the development of medicine and health as a theme.

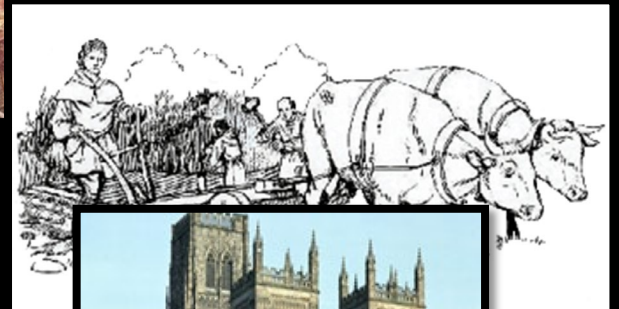


Health care for all

This is an opportunity to study a turbulent period in Germany's history, including the trauma of World War One and the collapse of democracy in the post-war years. The experience of the Germans under Nazi rule is also explored in depth.
