<p>Summary:</p> <p>Travel and Tourism covers a wide range of employment opportunities in one of the fastest growing industries in the UK. It includes jobs in airlines and hotels, with tour operators and travel agents or involving tourist attractions, conferences and events, hospitality and entertainment. Gaining a qualification in Tourism at this level can lead to Higher Education, apprenticeships and employment opportunities.</p> <p>The course comprises a mixture of examinable and controlled assessed units of work.
