People in healthy relationships...

Tell the truth to the other person

Listen to the other person's ideas when making choices

Tell lies to the other person

Help the other person

The police can keep those who have abused the child away so they are safe.

Children's services might talk to the child and plan ways of keeping them safe.

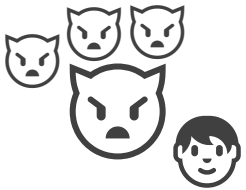

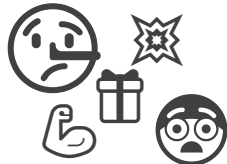

CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION is where



A person or group targets a child under 18, even 16 and 17 year olds who can consent to sex...



They use lies, threats, violence, false promises, gifts, emotional blackmail, & actual blackmail...



To get the child to do sexual things with them or other people, maybe touching, or just watching...



They might give the child something they want for doing it, like clothes, alcohol, money, popularity...



The perp might do it for money and status themselves, particularly when other abusers are involved...



And at first it might look like the child consents, or it might not be IRL, but online through nudes and videos.

TYPES OF GROOMING

👉 These are just 3 common types of grooming and examples of some of the behaviour of groomers. All of these exploit an imbalance of power with a child, like age, loneliness, or anxiety about sexuality.

Authority figure

Check the signs you're in a healthy relationship. Whether it's abuse or exploitation, you can get help.



If you're under 18 you can contact Childline for advice and support. You can call or chat online for free.



Report it to the police. They can help keep you safe through referrals and investigating crimes.



GETTING HELP

Help is out there – whether to find a child somewhere safe to stay or stop someone from exploiting a child.

Make sure to talk to a trusted adult like a family member, teacher or youth worker.

HOW DO I KEEP SAFE? AT HOME, ONLINE & OUTSIDE

WHAT IS THIS? An interactive booklet on families and domestic abuse that your local police force, Humberside Police, want children and families to know more about so they can stay safe in the future. This has been made as part of Operation Galaxy.

OP GALAXY? An operation by Humberside Police to reduce crime & anti social behaviour, protect vulnerable people and tackle some big problems like the topics below.

HOW WILL THIS WORK? Over 4 weeks in June we will be sending an interactive booklet just like this out to schools to include as part of their home education plans for children still at home, or as part of their classroom learning for those who have returned to school.
