Year 3	 Our PE topic is called 'ABC'. What do these letters stand for? What does 'perimeter' mean? 	
Year 4	 What did early invaders look for, when creating a new settlement? What is a numerator and what is a denominator? How do you remember these? 	
Year 5	 Why is there more than one time zone in a country? Can you discuss what child labour is and why it needs to stop? 	
Year 6	 Why is the Torah so important to Jewish people? What's the meaning of 'textural effects'? 	

Class Focus



Each week, we focus on work undertaken by a different class. This week, it was the turn of Reception B who say ... the children have been engaged in the book 'Supertato'. This story tells the adventures of a very brave potato who helps rescue the vegetables from the Evil Pea. When the children returned from lunch on Tuesday, they were shocked to discover that the Evil Pea had

trapped Supertato under a basket! The children's mission was to rescue Supertato, but also to go on a hunt around the school to find the Evil Pea. Unfortunately, the Evil Pea was too clever and he left no trail of his

whereabouts! Our mission was not completely unsuccessful, as we found a letter from the Evil Pea. In the letter, the Evil Pea told us that he was actually a friendly pea but he just liked to cause mischief - this did not stop the Jellyfish thinking of more ways to trap the Evil Pea.

Q & A Time

This week, we continue to focus on British Values. Pupils learn about the British Values through weekly PSHE lessons, as part of 'The Big Question'. This week's focus is 'Individual Liberty' (the right to believe, act and express oneself freely):

A. We ensure pupils are informed about how to keep themselves safe and the potential

dangers eq. internet safety - this enables pupils to make informed decisions about how they behave, including how they respond to others.

A. In our HELP lessons (part of our PSHE curriculum), pupils learn about a range of concepts linked to Individual Liberty such as stereotyping, respecting differences, taking responsibility, bullying and human rights.

A. So far this year, pupils have explored the following Big Questions as part of learning about Individual Liberty:

- How do people win a Nobel Prize?

- How have playgrounds changed over time?

- Should more of our learning take place outside?

A. When significant world events occur, such as the conflict between Ukraine and Russia, we ensure that we provide pupils with the opportunity to discuss how they are feeling. Pupils can see how a person's 'individual liberty' is affected by events such as this, and the importance of doing all we can to protect it.



World Book Day

Yesterday, everyone in school celebrated world book day! The children watched 'The Masked Reader' and had to guess which member of staff was hidden behind each mask. We had such a fun time, and it was lovely to see so many children and staff dressed up in their wonderful costumes!
