Describe connections...</p> <p>Use appropriate terminology and methods to present information about the past.</p>	<p><b>Knowledge</b></p> <p>WWII started in 1939 and continued until 1945. Treaty of Versailles was created to hopefully stop another war from happening. Many thought it wasn't fair.</p> <p>Britain, France and America were involved in WWII along with other allies.</p> <p>Germany started WWII by invading Poland. Britain's ports were bombed by the Germans in order to sink ships from the British Army and to sink supply ships.</p> <p>The Blitz (German word for lightning) was the systematic bombardment of London which started 7<sup>th</sup> September 1940 and continued every night for 57 nights.</p> <p>The Germans also bombed other parts of Britain including Bolton throughout the War. People built Anderson shelters in their gardens to protect themselves from bombs and shrapnel.</p> <p>People blacked out their windows and turned off all lights. This was called the blackout.</p>	<p><b>Knowledge</b></p> <p>People and children had to carry gas masks and identity cards.</p> <p>Children were evacuated from cities, where it could be dangerous because of the bombing. 3.5 million people, mainly children, were evacuated.</p> <p>Children were evacuated to smaller towns, villages and the countryside – usually with strangers.</p> <p>Children were usually evacuated by train.</p> <p>Jewish people were persecuted by the Nazis. Millions of Jewish people were killed by Hitler and his forces.</p> <p>The Nazis captured Jews amongst others and placed them in Prisoners of War Camps such as the notorious Auschwitz.</p> <p>Nicholas Winton managed to save many Jewish children from Czechoslovakia and Poland by bringing them to England on what is called the Kinder Transport.</p>
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### WHAT?

This year, we're starting to create 'Subject Organisers' for some of the subjects that your child will be studying in class (initially these will be for history, geography, RE and science). These will include key vocabulary, knowledge and skills that your child will cover during their learning.

These subject organisers will be regularly referred to during lessons, they will be accessible to pupils on their iPads, and a paper copy will also be sent home.

### WHY?

There are two reasons:

1. You can support your child with their learning (asking them questions about what they have learnt, checking to see what they know, asking them to tell you what specific words mean, helping them to regularly review and check previous learning during the next year, etc).
2. Subject Organisers will support your child's ability to remember and recall their learning, and encourage them to review their previous learning (helping it move to their long-term memory).



Each week, we focus on work undertaken by a different class. This week, it is the turn of 1L... this week, we have learning about belonging. We have learnt how babies are welcomed into different religions through special ceremonies like baptisms. We have also learnt about different religious symbols and had a go at making our own.
