



Ladybridge Learning Conversations

Do you ever ask your child, 'What have you been learning at school today?', and they respond, 'Nothing'? Well, ask them these questions instead, and see what they say! We'll be sending home two weekly questions per year group to support your learning conversations at home. Look out for these on Class Dojo and here on the newsletter!

Reception	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you explain how we can 'persuade' somebody? Can you make a repeating pattern, with 3 different objects?
Year 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What's the difference between evergreen and deciduous trees? Can you name the 5 different parts of a plant?
Year 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If I was trying to solve [] + 35 = 78, how would I work it out? Can you find the axel, wheel and chassis on a toy vehicle at home?
Year 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What do the words 'volume' and 'capacity' mean? Name the 3 types of ancient catapults.
Year 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Name 5 features of a river. What are the benefits of using a two paper stencil?
Year 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What is the difference between translating and reflecting shapes? What happens in the story of 'The Good Samaritan' and how does this Christian story link to the beliefs of Humanists?
Year 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How would you calculate 10% of an amount? 5%? 20%? 25%? 50%? Name five different types of cam and describe their movement.

Each week, we focus on work undertaken by a different class. This week, it was the turn of 1B who say ... last week, we had a very exciting trip to Crosby beach, as part of our geography topic. We studied the features of the beach, and saw some huge ships entering and leaving the port. We made sandcastles, flew kites, ate ice cream, ran up and down the sand dunes, and even paddled in the sea - which was very cold! This week, we have continued to use the knowledge from our trip, to extend our learning, and we created our own plasticine beaches. Once we had carefully scultped our beaches, we labelled them showing the human and physical features.
