#### Class Focus

Each week, we focus on work undertaken by a different class. This week, it was the turn of 4L who say ... This week we have continued with our study of the Ancient Egyptians. We have being using different skills to make replica clay pots. We have



also been learning about our digestive system, and the important role that each of our digestive organs play in keeping our bodies fit and well.

#### Covid measures

As Covid rates continue to remain high in Bolton, the Local Authority has asked schools to put additional measures in place from Monday:

KS2 pupils attending school who are close contacts with other household members who have Covid-19, should carry out daily lateral flow tests for 10 days after the onset of symptoms (or positive test result, if asymptomatic) of the case in their household, and only attend school if their lateral flow test is negative (people who have tested positive with a PCR test within the last 90 days do not need to be tested).

We will continue to promote regular handwashing, good classroom ventilation and implement some bubble separation. To avoid large indoor gatherings, we will continue with virtual whole school assemblies. Our approach to parents' evenings this term (telephone appointments) further reinforces our approach to minimising the spread of Covid-19.

#### SQUID GAME

A number of children at school have begun to re-enact some of the content from this show that they have viewed (or heard about via older family members) on the playground. As the game has 'lifethreatening consequences', we do not feel that this type of activity is appropriate. The Netflix show has an age rating of 15, but if you allow your child to watch this programme, please speak with them about not sharing it/playing it at school.
