Ladybridge Learning Conversations

Do you ever ask your child, 'What have you been learning at school today?', and they respond, 'Nothing'? Well, ask them these questions instead, and see what they say! We'll be sending home two weekly questions per year group to support your learning conversations at home. Look out for these on Class Dojo and here on the newsletter!

Reception	 Can you name the five 3D shapes that we have been learning about? Can you explain the life cycle of a butterfly?
Year 1	 Can you name, and use adjectives to describe, the items in Little Red's basket? Can you name three different materials? Can you describe their properties?
Year 2	 Can you find 1/2, 1/4 and 1/3 of different things in your house? Can you explain a life cycle for an animal you know?
Year 3	What are unit and non-unit fractions?How is water transported around a plant?
Year 4	 What stitches could you use, to sew two pieces of material together? How would you write the following numbers as a fraction: 5.1, 0.2, 3.8, 0.9?
Year 5	 What are the four layers of the rainforest, and how does the vegetation and wildlife differ between each layer? If you subtract a fraction from a mixed number fraction, what steps do you have to follow to find the answer?
Year 6	 Can you list four words that can be used as either a preposition or a subordinating conjunction? How can the perimeter of a rectangle be expressed algebraically?

Class Focus

Each week, we focus on work undertaken by a different class. This week, it was the turn of 2B who say ... in science, we have been learning about animals. We have been learning lots about offspring and are really enjoying looking at life cycles of different animals - we have even got some real life animals in our class to look after and watch them grow! Over the past few weeks, we have waited patiently for the eggs to hatch and on Monday morning, the first chick arrived! Since then, 13 more chicks have hatched. We have loved watching them hatch out of their eggs and snuggle up together inside the incubator. We can't wait to take care of them and see how much they change over the next couple of weeks. We are going to be EGG-sperts!

Q & A Time

Q. What is an Ofsted report and how important is it?

A. Inspectors from Ofsted (The Office for Standards in Education) visit schools approximately every four years, in order to make sure that schools provide a high standard of education for children. Inspectors will usually spend two days in school, gathering as much evidence as they can, so they can make a judgement on The Quality of Education, Behaviour & Attitudes, Personal Development, Leadership & Management and the Early Years Foundation Stage. After two days in school, a report is created, identifying what the inspectors feel that school does well, and what they need to improve.
