

#### <u>Year 6 Parents</u>

The Local Authority does not post out letters or booklets to parents anymore, but the admissions booklet can be viewed online.

## The deadline for applications is 31<sup>st</sup> October 2020.

### School Dinners

Please remember that if you wish your child to change from packed lunches to school dinners, or vice versa, we must receive <u>a minimum</u> <u>of one week's</u> notice. It is important that the dinner numbers are correct each day, as the school is charged for every meal ordered (even for KS1 children, who receive school meals free of charge from the Government). School dinner numbers have been fluctuating a lot recently, with some children swapping dinner preference without letting school know. Unfortunately, this is not something that we can accommodate. Please ensure your child's meal pattern is accurately recorded in school and, if you wish to change this, please notify the school office staff, giving <u>at least</u> one week's notice.
