Year of 2023 will begin on Sunday 22 February, and the festival will last for 16 days. 2023 is the Year of the Hare/Rabbit, according to the Chinese zodiac. The Chinese Zodiac, known as Sheng Xiao, is based on a twelve-year cycle, with each year in the cycle relating to an animal sign. These signs, in order, are the rat, ox, tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, sheep, monkey, rooster, dog and pig. It is calculated according to the Chinese lunar calendar.

School Meals Procedure

All children are able to book a school meal on a weekly basis. These meals need to be paid for in advance by 9.00 a.m. on the Monday morning, for that week.

If your child is on school meals and you want to change them to packed lunches you **must** inform the office the week before the change happens. This is due to the fact that food is pre-ordered for the following week. The meal pattern will remain as set as a school meal unless a parent/carer confirms by email to the school office that you wish to change to packed lunches. The change in meal pattern will be actioned and the office will send you an email confirming the change. Please do not rely on your child advising the teacher as they often forget and then a debt accumulates, which you will be liable for as the meals will have been made and school has to pay Bolton Council for them (the kitchen is managed by Bolton Council not the school).
