Q&A

Recently, a number of parents have enquired about taking children on holiday during the last few weeks of term.

- Q. Why should I not take my child out of school during term-time?
- A. There are many reasons:
- Pupils are entitled to 190 days of education every year for every day that your child is not in school, they <u>miss</u> <u>important learning</u>. This means that gaps can appear in their knowledge and understanding, which puts them at a disadvantage in class.
- All term-time holidays will be recorded as 'unauthorised absence' which will result in both parents being fined.
- The school curriculum is packed full and is planned across the whole year, including the final week. School holidays are the only time when pupils won't miss any learning (and there are $\underline{13}$ weeks across the year that are for school holidays).
- If we allowed staff to take holidays during term-time, then there would be no-one to teach your child!
