As you know, we have recently changed our half-termly homework tasks so that they are all linked to the subject organisers. However, we've heard that some parents are struggling to think of activities that they can do. So, here are some ideas that you might like to try, to help your child remember and recall their learning (linked to their subject organisers):

- Make a model
- Create a poster or PowerPoint presentation
- Research: create an A-Z of facts or create a fact-file
- Create a wordsearch
- Draw and/or label a diagram, scene or object
- Write a diary or story
- Create a mindmap or recreate the subject organiser from memory
- Conduct an experiment
- Visit and take photographs
