100 Mile Challenge

This week, we are launching the 100 Mile Challenge Programme - to get all pupils to complete and record 100 miles of physical activity during the academic year.

Miles can be measured both within and outside of the school day, through walking, running, cycling, swimming and anything else that which involves covering distance (eg. playing a football match). Your child has been given a card today, to record every mile they complete this year. Please keep this

safe, but also handy so you can mark off every time they complete a

mile.

Every time they have completed certain milestones (10 miles, 25 miles, 50 miles, 75 miles, 100 miles), please let your child's class teacher know, so we can award a certificate.

It would be great if you could take regular photos of the card and post them on Class Dojo, so we can celebrate how well everyone is doing.

We're not expecting the challenge to be completed until 2024, but when the card is complete, please bring it back into school. Our aim is for children and young people to feel more motivated, confident and able to get active - which will also increase the likelihood of being active later in life. This programme will also support all children in meeting the levels of physical activity recommended by government).

Helpful hints:

- There are 1600 metres in a mile.
- Measure your child's stride if you want really accurate tracking!
- Use your smart phone to tell you the distance walked from one place to another.
- If you're counting steps, there's about 2,600 steps in a mile for a child walking!
- In a 15minute football/rugby type game, a child is likely to cover about $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile.
