Vision for PE and School Sport

The teaching and learning of PE allows children to develop a core set of fundamental movement skills which they will apply across a broad range of physical activities. Children will grow in confidence so that they are able to access physical activity and sport at their own level. Our goal is to create learners who are physically active beyond primary school by equipping them with the knowledge and skills that they need in order to ensure long-term healthy and active lifestyles.

All children, during their time at Lancaster Lane, will have opportunities to engage in competitive sports and activities tailored to meet their needs. Aspects of personal, social, emotional and health education are embedded throughout the units of study, as well as character values, to further our children's understanding of themselves and others.

We are fortunate to have a full time PE specialist, who teaches PE sessions, provides CPD for staff, assess progress across school and arranges enrichment opportunities both in and out of school

Impact of Funding

Improving Staff Knowledge and Confidence

Investment in staff professional development and swimming training has enhanced teachers' subject knowledge and confidence in delivering high-quality PE lessons. This has improved the consistency and quality of PE provision across the school. Mr Johnson has completed his Level 5 certificate, meaning he is now a PE Specialist.

Increasing Opportunities for Pupils

Funding has enabled the school to provide a broad range of extra-curricular sporting and physical activity opportunities, increasing participation and encouraging pupils to adopt active lifestyles. We have ensured that key groups across school have opportunities to enjoy sport and competitions, including our SEND, disadvantaged and female pupils.

Enhancing Resources

We continually need new equipment and resources to improve the quality of lessons and enable a wider range of physical activities to be delivered across the curriculum and during enrichment sessions. Our PE equipment also requires regular safety checks to ensure they are able to be used safely.

School Games and Competition

Through our membership with Chorley Sports, pupils have benefited from a variety of festivals, events and competitive opportunities that promote teamwork, resilience and sporting values. Many, many children across school have the opportunity to take part in these across the year.

Targeted Support

The school has used funding to improve opportunities and participation for:

- Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

- Pupils with long-term medical conditions
- Girls participating in PE and extra-curricular sport
- Disadvantaged pupils

These targeted approaches ensure that all pupils can access and benefit from high-quality physical activity and sporting opportunities.

Swimming and Water Safety

Impact

The school's swimming provision has had a positive impact on pupil attainment in swimming and water safety. The vast majority of pupils leave Year 6 meeting or exceeding national curriculum expectations for swimming. Whilst we do not spend money on further top-up lessons, we tailor our final term of swimming to ensuring our children with less confidence in the water are able to have further sessions to help enable them to gain their statutory swimming objectives and confidence beyond this.

Sustainability and Future Development

The school has focused investment on sustainable improvements by:

- Developing staff expertise through CPD and training.
- Investing in resources that will benefit future cohorts.
- Maintaining engagement with Chorley Sports.
- Promoting participation among underrepresented groups.
- Continuing to develop inclusive opportunities for all pupils.
