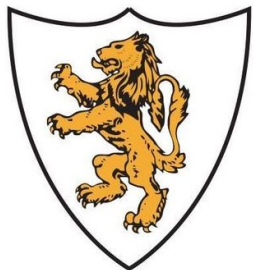

Stonehenge Class

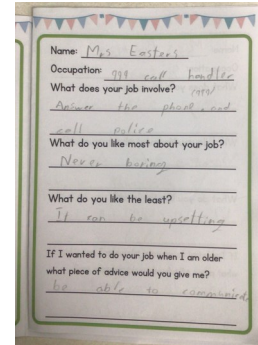
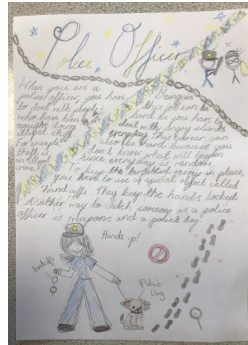
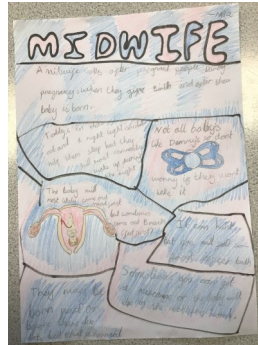
