# Term 5



### English





We are continuing our writing journey with inspiration from 'Lost in the Toy Museum' and will write a setting description. Along with making sure we are consistently using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops we are learning the suffix – 'est' and dipping our toes into when to use an exclamation mark!

In the final two weeks we will be reading the book 'Tidy', planting seeds and writing a set of instructions on how to do so.

#### Maths

This term we are adding and subtracting numbers to 20 using known facts, such as number bonds to ten and ways in which we can partition smaller numbers. We are trying not to use our fingers or counting on. Please look at the Knowledge Organiser which will explain this further (or ask at drop off/pick up ©).

We will be starting our multiplication journey; doubling and halving, continuing to count in 2s, 5s and 10s, using arrays, grouping and sharing.

### **Topic: Titanic**

We are very excited to be doing a new topic this term where will be exploring a significant event in History – the sinking of the Titanic! We will be learning about the events that happened that fateful night. Why not take your child to the Titanic exhibition in Southampton – it is great fun and a fantastic way to learn about the White Star liner.

#### What else are we learning?

- Our Jigsaw focus is relationships; family structure, friendships, people who help us and how we greet others.
- In Computing we will be learning about the various aspects of using a computer to create and change text. The children will be typing on a keyboard and begin using tools to change the look of their writing. They will consider differences between using a computer and writing on paper to create text.
- In DT we will be making our own puppets.

Continue to read daily with your child. Please find attached number and letter formation sheets to use at home. Write numbers to 20 in numerals and words.





Flare	A light sent into the sky to get help










- The ship was built for 3,547 people but there were only enough lifeboats for 1 out of every 3 people
- All 700 third class passengers had to share two bathtubs!
- Titanic remained hidden from the world for over 70 years. It wasn't until 1985 that it was seen again when found by divers.
- The longest living survivor from Titanic was Millvina Dean, who lived until 2009 – she was a baby when she was rescued.


