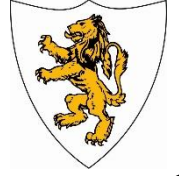

Term 6

English

We will be heading in to space with 'Look Up'; a book we have read previously in our book talk sessions. This time we will be finding out about Meteor Showers, creating posters and writing a retell as the main character, Rocket.

As we come to the end of the year, the children will be encouraged to edit their work themselves before showing an adult. We continue to work on handwriting and perfecting our sentence structure ready for the exciting challenges in Year 2!

Maths

This term we are adding and subtracting numbers to 20 using known facts, such as number bonds to ten and ways in which we can partition smaller numbers. We are trying not to use our fingers or counting on.

We will be starting our multiplication journey; doubling and halving, continuing to count in 2s, 5s and 10s, using arrays, grouping and sharing.

We will be recognising and learning about the worth of coins and applying our counting in 2s, 5s and 10s knowledge to this learning.

Topic – Oceans and Under the Sea.

Earlier in the year, we discovered the different continents on our planet and named the five oceans. This term we will be diving into the oceans and learning about the different marine life and fun facts such as which is the deepest, warmest and the largest. Ask the children to share the fun songs that they know!

What else are we learning?

During PE this term we will be learning how to play cricket.

Our jigsaw focus will be 'change'. This starts with us looking at how we have changed from when we were a baby and the things we can now do. It leads nicely on to transition and coping with change to a new class.

In RE we will be learning to empathise with Jewish children by understanding how it feels to take part in Chanukah activities.

Bioluminescent	When living things give out light

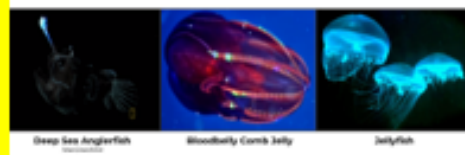


- The world is made up of 7 continents and 5 oceans. The 5 oceans are;

The oceans of the world in order of size:



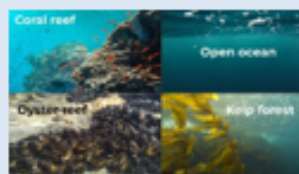
Animals which make their own light use bioluminescence!
