### English -



This term we will be reading Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Over the term we will be working on our prediction and inference skills.



In our writing sessions, we will be using The Egyptian Cinderella to inform our writing. Specific skills we are looking at include using paragraphs to group ideas, beginning, middle and end. In addition, we will be punctuating speech using inverted commas.

### Maths -



Our topics in Maths this term are measures (length, mass and capacity), geometry (properties of shape, angles) and statistics (interpreting data). As well as learning these topics in our main lessons, we will be continuing to practise elements of our past learning. We will continue to do the times tables booklets daily looking at multiplication and division facts.

### Science – Scientists and Investigations

This term we will be learning about different scientists including William Smith & Inge Lehmann and how they changed the world of science with their work. We will continue to recap on learning throughout year 3 and continue with our investigations to deepen our understanding of the world around us.

### What else are we learning?

**ART:** We will be learning about telling stories through drawing and making with a focus on the use of clay as an art medium.

**PSHE-** This term's topic is 'Changing me'. We will be learning about changes that happen socially, physically and emotionally as we grow.

**PE-** We will be developing our skills in Athletics.

**RE-** We will be learning to understand the significance of the River Ganges both for the Hindu and Non-Hindu.

**Music-** We will be exploring beats within music and thinking about how our bodies respond the beat as well as reflecting on our musical knowledge throughout the year.

**Computing-** We will continue to learn about keeping ourselves safe when online as well as considering our online identities.

### Topic –

In Geography we are starting our new topic about coasts. We will be learning about the coastline of Britain and the different features we would expect to find. The children will be identifying how we can protect our coastline as well as how coasts are used.

Please make sure that your child has a water bottle.

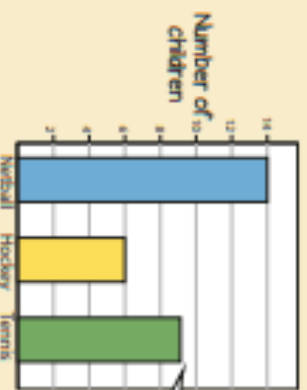

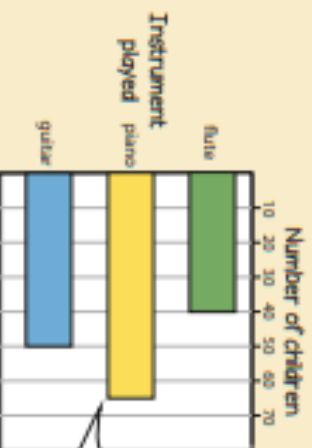

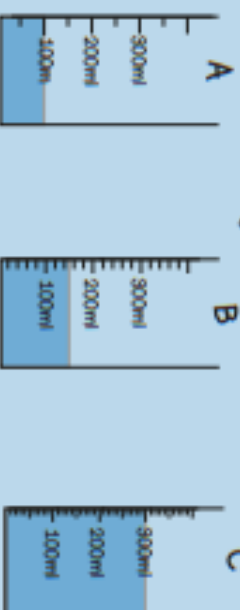

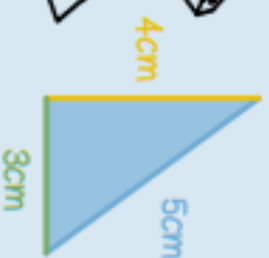

The angle is more than a right angle



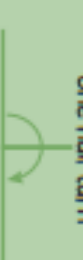
The angle is less than a right angle
