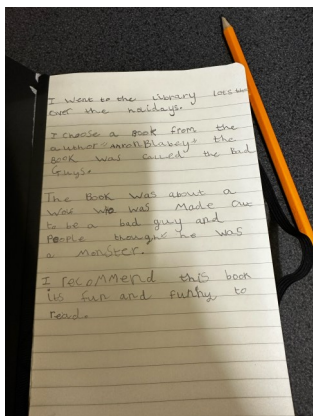

George Norris made this beautiful remembrance lantern at Beavers. What a brilliant way to demonstrate our values of peace and respect.

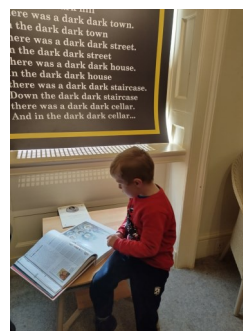
