Autumn













English

In English the children will start by looking at the story 'Peace at last' by Jill Murphy. Our focus will be using description and impressive vocabulary to make our writing interesting. We will be including adjectives, conjunctions and adverbs in our writing and extending our sentences from simple sentences to more complex sentences. Our daily phonics sessions will continue with recapping sounds with our main focus being to develop fluency in our reading.

<u>Maths</u>

In maths we will begin by focusing on 'number and place value'. The children will be identifying what each digit in a number represents and learning how to partition numbers into their tens and units. We will be comparing numbers using the terms greater and less than and using the symbols to match. We will continue to develop our mental math skills, particularly focusing on recalling number bonds and introducing multiplication facts through the use of Times Table Rock stars

<u>Art</u>

Our first topic in Art will explore sculpture through making maps. The children will begin by exploring maps and then recreate their own map style using materials. They will evaluate their work and then move onto designing a printing tile. They will then develop the skills needed to create their own art piece.

<u>History</u>

In history we will be learning about The Great Fire Of London. We will travel back in time to 1666 and learn about how the fire started and what made it spread so quickly. The children will look at evidence for the past and eye witness statements as well as a visit from the local fire brigade!

Science

Our science topic starts with 'Materials' We will begin by learning about the different types of materials and their uses. The children will explore how the same materials can be used for different purposes and their suitability. We will conduct an investigation to find out the best materials to make a chair for a teddy.

RE

In religious studies the children will begin with discussing why light is an important symbol for Christians, Jews and Hindus? They will be making comparisons and identifying the similarities and differences. Next we will move on to learn about the importance of Jesus to Christians and the nativity
