Year 3 | Summer



English

In English we will be basing our writing around the book 'The Angel of Nitshill Road' by Anne Fine.. This book has a main focus on the issue of bullying and the children will spend time discussing the characters' thoughts and feelings and how they change throughout the story.

Maths

During summer term there is a large focus around measurement. We will begin by looking at time and will progress through to length and perimeter and finally mass and capacity. We will also be revisiting our fraction topic to develop our knowledge from spring term.

History

Our History topic is centred around the Romans. The children will investigate what life was like during this period. They will research how the Romans were able to build such a strong empire and how they ruled for the length of time they did.

Geography

This term we are investigating European Neighbours with the country of Italy. We will be identifying different features of Italy, from its active volcanoes and mountain ranges, to tourism. We will also draw links to our History topic through the city of Rome.

Science

As scientists we will be studying light this term. We will explore different light sources and be able to scientifically discuss reflective materials, as well as delving into the dangers that come with the sun. The children will also have opportunity to conduct an investigation into their shadows.

RWV

During our Religion and worldwide view lessons this term we will be exploring the question of 'What do Muslims believe about God?' We will be encouraged to ask questions and think like a Theologian.
