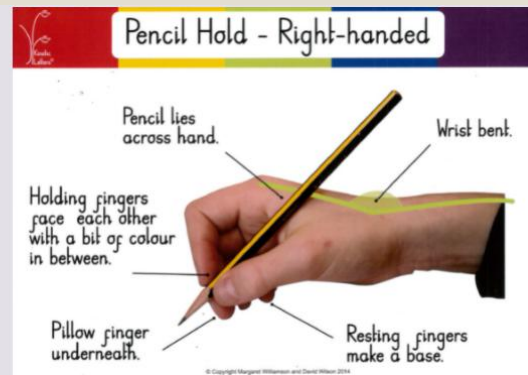
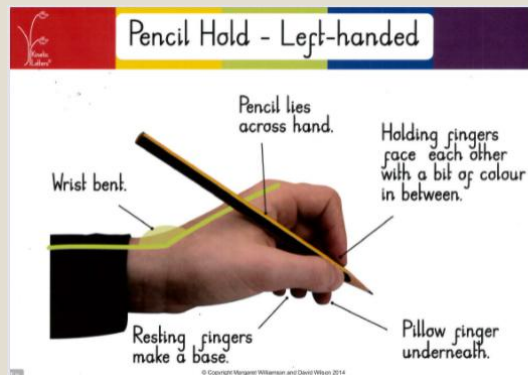
Our Typical Day

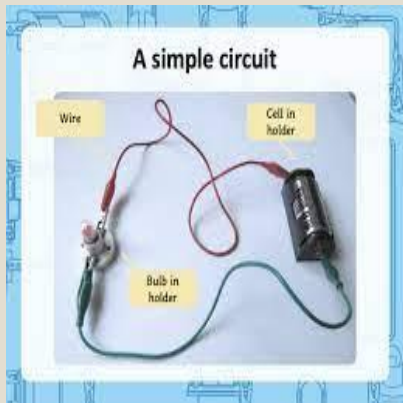

Did You Know?

Children spend 20% of their school life in playtime.

Why Play Matters:

Builds friendships & social skills

Improves physical health & activity

Develops independence & problem-solving

Supports emotional wellbeing

The Challenge Today:

Children spend 4+ hours a day on screens but less than 1 hour outdoors

Children now spend less time outside than prison inmates (National Trust, 2016)

Opportunities for free, child-led play are shrinking

How Parents Can Help:

Please ensure your child has named wellies in school

A waterproof coat (and trousers if possible)

Outdoor play happens in *all* weathers — being prepared means children can fully enjoy it!

ENGLISH	Create 5 questions that you would ask to Mrs. Large about what happened when she wanted 5 minutes peace. Remember to use a question mark at the end of each question.  Example: What was the funniest thing your children did when you were in the bath?	In the story '5 minutes peace' Mrs. Large was looking for a peaceful place. think about a place where you would go if you wanted five minutes of peace, just like Mrs. Large. What things would you put in it to make it calm, relaxing and peaceful? Design and label your ideally peaceful place.	<u>Link it</u> - Choose a topic such as the farm. The first person says something that would be linked to the topic. Each player then takes turns to add something related to the topic. Example <u>Topic</u> Farm: player 1 - cow, player 2 - hay, etc. if you can't say something you are out.

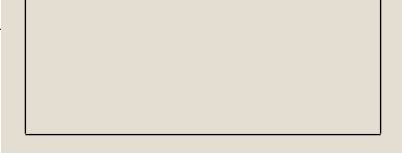
