Monday 20th	<p>Read Little Red Hen. Tuesday 21st	<p>Draw or paint of one of the animals in the story: Little Red Hen, Sleepy cat, lazy dog or a noisy duck.</p>
Wednesday 22 <sup>nd</sup>	<p>Make a model windmill using cardboard boxes/Recycle junk. Talk about the colours and shapes used.</p>
Thursday 23 <sup>rd</sup>	<p>Maths Puzzle: If the Little Red Hen bakes 4 rolls and then 1 more. How many will she have? Of Little Red hen had 5 rolls and she ate 1, how many will be left? Work on 1 more and 1 less puzzles up to the number 10.</p> <p>You can draw a picture to help you work out the answer.</p>
Friday 24 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Talk about flour and make some bread rolls together. Make and knead the dough and bake in the oven together.</p>
