Our catch-up monitoring strategies are:

- · Identifying and targeting gaps in students' knowledge.
- Collecting attainment data from the Autumn term to enable teachers to identify gaps. This has also been supported by data collected from formative assessments.
- Enabling and supporting students to access materials, remote lessons and partake in learning.
- · Identifying a cohort of students who will benefit from small group tuition.
- Supporting and addressing student wellbeing through curriculum and pastoral roles.
