Other news

We had our first Covid cases of the term this week. Can I remind everyone not to send your children into school if they are showing any covid symptoms? The Delta Variant symptoms include cold-like symptoms (like a runny nose). Please keep your children at home with symptoms like these. This reduces the risk greatly and lessens the amount of complicated contact tracing that we have to do.

Can I remind parents of our policy about students having phones in school during the covid restrictions? Our policy (which is in place to protect students and parents from surreptitious filming etc.) is this:

Students will NOT be handing in phones - but if a phone is seen or heard to go off (text/call anywhere in the school grounds) then the phone will be confiscated - refusal to hand over the phone will result in a fixed term exclusion.

If students need to communicate with their parents during school, they should use the school office. If they need to phone after school, they should wait until they are outside the school gates.

As the weather gets hotter and hotter, some parents are concerned about students being unable to get water. We had to close our school water fountains as a result of the covid crisis. However, we are now opening two of the water fountains, one in PE and one in the dining area for the refilling of bottles only. These stations will only be available at break and lunch and the fountain in the dining hall will be supervised by staff. Both fountains will be cleaned regularly. Please send your children to school with a water bottle containing plenty of water. They will be able to get drinks from the canteen at lunch.
