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Household Support Fund

We are pleased to advise Newham Council has again decided to allocate funding from the Department for Work and Pensions Household Support Fund to schools to provide food vouchers to children eligible for free school meals for the 2023 May Half Term holiday. The funding will cover food voucher costs for children from Reception to Year 11 who are currently in receipt of statutory (benefits related) Free School Meals (FSM), at the same rate of £15 per eligible child, for one week. The grant funding available is sufficient to enable the Council to provide an additional 10% in food voucher funding to give schools the flexibility to support children identified as vulnerable that do not qualify for statutory FSM. Grant letters and payments will be issued to schools and colleges very shortly to enable payments to be made to families before the holiday begins.
