Headteacher Q &A:

Thank you to all parents who attended the Headteacher's Question and Answer session. This session started with a presentation regarding our recent OFSTED inspection.

As I have stated previously, both of the recommendations made in the OFSTED report have already been included in our planning since the start of this academic year, and the lead inspector also stated, "if we came back in three months, I am sure you would meet all of the criteria for 'outstanding'.

We also recently received a letter from Vik Verma, Newham Director of Education, Inclusion and Achievement.

He stated: 'Your inspection took place after a wider recalibration of the Ofsted inspection grading under the new framework. Despite these changes, I was delighted to read the many authentic examples of the dedication of your staff and the commitment of your students. It should be a source of pride that inspectors found such a wide range of evidence of practice to praise. Reading about the culture of aspiration for all pupils, the breadth and ambition of the curriculum, and the quality of support for pupils with special educational needs was testament to the ambition you hold for your pupils. Throughout the report, inspectors rightly found evidence of you nurturing school, where courage, commitment and compassion are the overarching values.

We look forward to hearing about the next stage of the school's development, and indeed what other schools in the borough can learn from Little Ilford's approach. But first I hope you can all reflect on the successes found in this report.'

I think you'll agree, there is a lot for us to be proud of, and we see this inspection and the report as a positive part of our journey. It validates the plans already in place and gives us a very clear target to aim for.

Household Support Fund

We are pleased to advise Newham Council has again decided to allocate funding from Department for Work and Pensions Household Support Fund to schools to provide food vouchers to children eligible for free school meals for the February half term break. The Council has decided to issue a grant payment to all infant, junior, primary and secondary schools in Newham in line with the approach taken for previous school holidays. The funding will cover food voucher costs for children in years Reception to year 11 who are currently in receipt of statutory (benefits related) Free School Meals (FSM), to cover the five days of the February half term holiday period. In line with the approach taken for the previous vouchers issued by the school we will be sending £15 vouchers for the holidays through text and or email using Wonde. The vouchers will be sent out on the last day of the term.
