Holiday food vouchers:

We are pleased to advise Newham Council has again decided to allocate funding from the Department for Work and Pensions Household Support Fund to schools to provide food vouchers to children eligible for free school meals for the February half term. The Council has decided to issue a grant payment to all Infant, Junior, Primary and Secondary Schools in Newham in line with the approach taken for previous school holidays. The funding will cover food voucher costs for children from Reception to Year 11 who are currently receiving statutory (benefits related) Free School Meals (FSM), to cover the five days of the February half term holiday period. In line with the approach taken for the previous vouchers issued by the school, we will send £15 vouchers for the half term break through text and/or email using Wonde. The vouchers will be sent out on the last day of term.
