

## Message for Parents

As you know, the government has mandated that all schools are closed until further notice, except for the parents of key workers and vulnerable children (see the advice in the link below). Clearly, this is an unprecedented decision which will be a relief to many but also prompts a number of questions.

Little Ilford School is supporting parents and students in continuing with their learning by setting students' work and activities.

Parents, we ask you to understand that no amount of preparation will replicate the typical school day, and that it is not feasible for our teachers to give regular individual support to students at this time.

At this stage, we are attempting to provide access to education that supports parents in making decisions about how to educate their child. You, as the parent, know best how to support your children, especially given your current home situation regarding working from home and taking care of children or relatives who may live with you.

Please also consider that you are not expected to become a "stay at home teacher", whilst also trying to be a parent. Your wellbeing is important during this time, and we would like to support that through the way we set educational work for your children.

We will share with you and your child, via this website, subject specific work that your child can complete. This will take the form of a menu of weekly tasks to choose from. These can be found [here](#):

Each subject will be setting tasks that are easy enough for all students to access without needing a teacher/tutor/parent to work with them (even if they get some parts wrong, or have to think really hard). Each subject will also set tasks that are more open, creative and collaborative. Not all tasks are compulsory - there will be opportunities for your children to select an activity that interests them.
