They were extremely impressed by the work of the staff at Little Ilford School and also the students and the School Council with whom they had a Question and Answer session. Our students really were outstanding representatives of the school.

Appointments during the school day

Could I remind parents if a child has to attend an appointment during the school day, they will need to provide evidence, such as a copy of the appointment letter, to their Pastoral Achievement Leader (PAL). Please sign their planner indicating the time they need to leave school. Once approved by the PAL it will be the child's responsibility to leave their lesson on time.

Free School Meals holiday funding:

We are pleased to advise Newham Council has again decided to allocate funding from the Department for Work and Pensions Household Support Fund to schools to provide food vouchers to children eligible for free school meals for the October half term. The Council has decided to issue a grant payment to all Infant, Junior, Primary and Secondary Schools in Newham in line with the approach taken for previous school holidays. The funding will cover food voucher costs for children from Reception to Year 11 who are currently in receipt of statutory (benefits related) Free School Meals (FSM), to cover the five days of the October half term holiday period. In line with the approach taken for the previous vouchers issued by the school we will be sending £15 vouchers for the half term through text and or email using Wonde. The vouchers will be sent out on the last day of term.

Autumn break activities:

Autumn is here with us and we have a range of fun and exciting activities for the Autumn School Break for children of all ages (including those who are vulnerable) to enjoy. Most of the activities are free, some are at subsidised prices as indicated on the attached brochure. There is a wide range of activities to do during this school break at our Youth Zones, Libraries, Leisure Centres, Children's Centres and Parks. There are many face to face activities as well as online activities over Zoom.

Please view the brochure and see what appeals to you, from Pony Rides, BMX sessions, Youth Dances, Black History Month (BHM) Movies and events, Youth Choir singing, Combat Sports, Badminton to Halloween Parties, Stories and Quizzes and so much more, the list is endless.

Thank you to all of the parents who attended our Coffee Morning. I will arrange similar events during the next half term.
