#### **Assessment Reports**

A couple of times a year, parents will be given a paper copy of a report, that gives information on the progress students are currently making in their subjects.

This document aims to explain what to expect on the reports, and when to expect them.

#### **All Reports**

In each report you will be told:

- Effort, Organisation, Homework scores out of 4.
- 1: Excellent
- 2: Good
- 3: Requires Improvement
- 4: Significant Improvement Required

Organisation	Preparation for learning i.e. bringing appropriate kit or equipment to lesson.
Effort	Effort made by student to engage actively in their learning and constantly seek to improve.
Homework	How well homework is completed and if it is completed on time.

#### **All Reports**

In each report you will also be told:

- % attendance, including number of absences that are authorised and unauthorised.
- Positive conduct points points awarded to students who show a positive attitude to their learning and the learning experience of others.
- Negative conduct points points given to students when a LIS rule is broken, and disrespect is shown to those around them.

## **KS3 - Y7, 8**

- Teacher Judgement: Teachers will award a score of 1 to 4 to students, based on how well the student is meeting learning expectations at that given time. This takes into account the students' prior knowledge and achievement in Primary School and how well we would expect them to do in their GCSEs.
- 1: Excellent exceeding learning expectations
- 2: Good meeting learning expectations
- 3: Requires Improvement not yet meeting learning expectations
- 4: Significant improvement required in order to meet learning expectations

## **KS4 - Y9, 10, 11**

In each report you will be told:

- FFT (Fischer Family Trust) target: Your child's target GCSE grade for each subject.
- Teacher EFG (estimated final grade): The grade that your child's teacher will think they will achieve in their GCSE, given their current understanding, skills and attitude to work.
- Teacher Assessment: An average grade based on recent assessments completed within each subject.

Almost all subjects now use grades 1 to 9. A 4 is a good pass, a 5 is a strong pass, and 7 is similar to an old grade A and a grade 9 is the top grade possible.

### **KS3 - Y7, 8**

You will receive reports twice a year, once at your child's parents' evening and once at the end of the academic year. Y7 parents will also receive a simplified report at Y7 tutor evening in October.

# **KS4 - Y9, 10,**

You will receive reports twice a year, once at your child's parents' evening, and once at the end of the year.

## **KS4 - Y11**

You will receive reports three times a year, once in November, once at your child's parents' evening in January and once in April.
