Pathfinder Project

What is the Pathfinder Project?

Newham's Children Overrepresented Pathfinder Project which runs from December 2020 to March 2023, aims to identify children and young people of African, Caribbean, Asian, ROMA or other overrepresented heritage, aged 6-25, who have increased ACEs due to COVID-19 and a higher risk of involvement in the youth justice system; intervene with them individually, with their families, in schools and in the wider community; provide support and prevent them getting involved in the justice system in years to come as either victims or perpetrators. Through a referral system, the target beneficiaries can be referred to receive support such as mentoring, counselling, skills training, digital engagement support, career guidance etc. We provide these services in collaboration with partners in the Voluntary Sector. 
