Year 7 also travelled to Marden Bridge for the indoor athletics They demonstrated fantastic togetherness supporting each other, as well as LHS values in abundance!






# Inspire Clubs

A group of year 9 students enjoyed an employability and speed dating careers workshop from EY Foundation. The explored what a superpower a leadership superhero would have!




