

At Longbenton High Sixth Form, tutor time is a cornerstone of our ethos, with brilliant and dedicated tutors bringing years of experience in Key Stage 5. 

I attended Longbenton High School from 2016 to 2021, and then opted to continue my studies at Sixth Form for the following two years, due to the benefit of already having established **good relationships with the staff** who would be teaching me. During the COVID-19 lockdowns, I began researching into food more, as I found myself with lots of spare time which I often spent baking. I was particularly fascinated by the chemistry behind food, and how different compounds influence flavour and the structural properties of the product – the knowledge I gained from this passion as well as scientific knowledge gained from my studies, in particular Chemistry, allowed me to understand why certain ingredients were used in recipes, and it opened up an area of technical curiosity for myself, therefore leading me to apply for a **degree apprenticeship** alongside UCAS university application.

The apprenticeship was with a large confectionary business, based in Birmingham, gaining a degree in Food Science and Technology while working in the Research and Development department. I applied to the role as a potential extra opportunity for myself, and the SLT staff at Longbenton were incredibly helpful during the application process, offering support and practice with interview preparation, and putting me in contact with local recruiters who also helped me to improve my employability, and gave me an understanding of what to expect from a corporate interview. After multiple interviews and an on-site assessment centre day, I ended up getting the job!

I believe that opting to do this specific degree apprenticeship was the perfect choice for me, as the course delivery method at university was entirely conducted in-person via block weeks, and I knew I wanted to study a course with high contact hours. The added benefit of gaining work experience and being able to apply my knowledge from my studies really appealed to me, and I have been able to grow my independence so much though relocating to a new city. Also, the support network that is put in place by both universities and employers is exceptional, and makes the new change easier to adjust to. I would recommend a degree apprenticeship to anyone who is proactive and loves to learn, because you never stop learning!

My love of History began in a year 8 class at Longbenton, when the teacher first showed us a Peter Snow documentary about the Battle of Hastings. From then on, I always enjoyed History at school, but I was never as good at it as I would've liked. I first considered History as a career during my A-level years, when we studied the Russian Revolution and the Tudors. Again, my love for the subject slightly outweighed my ability; I loved researching and engaging with classes, but I hadn't yet developed enough as a writer. I didn't get the grades to get into my first choice university, but luckily I managed to get into my second choice. The reason I'm highlighting these academic troubles is because they were an important lesson. Despite not being a brilliant historian at 18, it was the qualities that I developed during my time at Longbenton, such as my enthusiasm for the subject and commitment to the work, that carried me through all the way to my PhD. While at Longbenton I also took part in the musicals and the choir. This taught me the value in 'putting myself out there', and I thoroughly believe these opportunities shaped me into the person that I am

I write to you now from Harvard University, where I am undertaking a research fellowship with one of the leading academics in Global History. My first article, 'Workers, Wives and Radicals' was published in Slavery & Abolition – a leading academic journal – in January 2024. Despite being a long way from home, there's not a day when I don't use the research skills and life lessons that I was taught at Longbenton. I'll be forever grateful for the time that I spent there.

Beyond the classroom





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The 16 to 19 Bursary Fund provides financial help to young people aged 16 to 19 who face financial barriers to participating in education or training.

If you are in Y12-14 in a North Tyneside sixth form in September you could be eligible for up to £1200 per year if you meet one of the criteria below:

- In care
- Left care having been in care for a minimum of 3 months from the age of 14
- In receipt of Income Support (or Universal Credit)
- In receipt of both Employment and Support Allowance (or Universal Credit) and Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payment

Discretionary bursaries are also available, the amount available depends on individual circumstances. The eligibility criteria for these include:

- Eligible for Free School Meals
- A family in receipt of Tax/Universal Credit
- Families with low household income
