Dear Parents, Carers & Students

I am delighted to share some highlights from this past half term at LHS, which has been filled with positivity, hard work, and community spirit. You can find this personal development **newsletter** on our website <u>here</u>. This includes upcoming events on the first page, but they are also included at the bottom of this letter.

We have also produced a **parent summary** of all of our main logistics and expectations at LHS which you can find on our website <u>here</u> - there is also a screenshot at the end of this letter. This summary includes information related to uniform, mobile phones, GCSE Pod, email contacts and so on, so that it is easy to reference in one place. If there is something that you feel is missing from this that you would like us to add, drop us an email and we will include feedback in an update next half term.

One of the reminders on this summary is mobile phones and I would like to bring to your attention again the increasing national concern around **teenage social media and phone use**. We have had a **mobile phone 'ban'** at LHS (in that phones should be off and away) for a long time at LHS. Unfortunately, students sometimes still text parents asking them to collect them if they feel unwell; we would appreciate parents using the correct channels to communicate with their child during the school day to avoid this. Josh MacAlister MP recently led the debate on the Safer Phones Bill in Parliament, which aims to make smartphones less addictive for children and empower families and teachers to reduce screen time. We strongly believe at LHS that students should have a break from their phones during the day. The <u>NSPCC</u> <u>website</u> offers some helpful guidance for parents on managing social media usage and its impact on young people.

Our **Sixth Form Open Evening** was incredibly well attended this week, as have been our **Year 6 parent tours** for those applying for Year 7 places next September. We have shown almost 70 families around during the day across the past 4 weeks, with increased interest from Amberley and Westmoor families in particular this year. 60% stated that our improved reputation was a significant factor in their interest in choosing our school. <u>Applications for Sixth Form</u> can now be made by Year 11 for September 2025 via our online form.

Finally, a quick update on **attendance**, which continues to be our number one priority this year at LHS. We expect all students to aim for an attendance rate of 95% or higher, as we know this is a strong predictor of success and happiness



in school. Our current whole school attendance has dropped as the term has progressed to 92% and we need parental support to help shift this in the right direction. Please continue to prioritise your child's attendance; in doing so you are helping to build strong foundations for their future success.

We **reopen after half term on Monday 4th November** at 8.45am. I wish you all a lovely half term with your families and loved ones.
