- 4. Search websites such as Newsround, Disability Rights UK to help you make a presentation on:

 - Mental disabilities
 - What life is like for different disabled people
 - Famous disabled people
 - What rights disabled people have e.g. in the workplace.

Week Beginning: 1 June 2020

The title for today's lesson is Is This Building Disability-Friendly?

- 1. Choose a building or outside space which you know well. It could be your house, school, or a local park.
- 2. Draw a plan ('bird's eye view') of the building or space.
- 3. Add labels to show what aspects of the building or space are 'disability-friendly' or 'disability-unfriendly' which parts might cause a disabled person problems or danger, and which parts would they be able to access well?
- 4. Now redesign your building or outside space so that it is as disability-friendly as possible.
