Lesson 2- Designing a set

Task 1

You have taken over the role of the set designer for Peter Pan. You have chosen to develop Hook's dressing room. **However, the set needs be able to move quickly to create the next scene**. Draw your set and label it using this link for <u>BBC Bitesize</u> to help you.

When describing set remember to include:

- Colour
- Texture/ Materials (Silk, cotton, smooth, rough)
- The state of wear (is it new or run down)
- Small details (jewellery on a dressing table)
- How will the set be used by the actors? (Does Hook have a chair to sit on? Does she stand on a platform?)
