Explore the piece by listening and responding to it. Think about these questions and make a mood board, poster, or documentary interview in response.

- 1. Listen to the lyrics, how many of your school subjects can you hear being mentioned?
- 2. Which instruments can you hear?
- 3. What style of music is this? What makes you think that?
- 4. How old do you think this piece of music is? Why?
- 5. What is the structure of the piece? (does it have verses, choruses, etc.?)
- 6. How does this music make you feel? Why?
- 7. What does the music make you think of? Why?
- 8. If the music was a story, what would the story be? Can you write the story?

Creative Arts

If this song was visual art, what would it look like? Create your own artwork based on this song (either the message in the lyrics or how the song makes you feel)

To do this you will need to listen to the song a number of times and think carefully about what it is about.

As well as or instead of a piece of art you could:

- Express the music as a poem.
- Choreograph a dance to this music.
- Create an animation in response to this song.

Performance


If you have an instrument at home, learn to play the song or a section of the song by ear, or with the help of notation.
