<u>History – What major Historical events do we celebrate in July?</u>

During a two week period you would ordinarily have:

3 History lessons. This is for the fortnight 06/07/20 - 16/07/20.

For the last few weeks of the academic year we are going to use our History lessons to focus on some of the events which changed the world, all of which happened in the month of July. The next 3 lessons will follow a slightly different format – each lesson or task is going to focus on a historical event rather than a topic. For each event you are going to research and produce a piece showcasing how important it was. Treat these lessons as 3 mini-projects.

Event 1

The Declaration of Independence.

On 4th July 1776 the War of Independence came to an end and the British lost control of their largest North American colony.

Your task is to produce a poster showing why this date is so important in American History. On this poster you should include the following.

- What happened to start the War of Independence?
- What is the Declaration of Independence?
- Where was this document signed and can you still see it today?
- Why is this date still so important in our world History?
- How do Americans celebrate the 4th of July?

- You might want to research the Astronauts Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins.
- The different stages of the mission
- Why is this such an important event?
