Dear Parent/Carer

I hope that all families have enjoyed a relaxing February half term break: a chance for our students to refresh before the busy and important half term ahead: internal exams, option choices, drama production, musical theatre rehearsals, preparing for external exams - the list could be very long indeed. Clearly I have not been around to be part of the day-to-day business of Longbenton but I know that all staff have been working hard with the students in their classes to help them achieve the best that they can; I know this because it is who we are as a school and who my staff are.

I want also to thank you all for the good wishes and positive feelings that you have conveyed towards me at this most difficult of times. I have been overwhelmed by all of this and it has really helped me in my recovery from the subarachnoid haemorrhage I suffered on Christmas Eve. I also need to thank the many people who have taken on extra responsibility and given more of their precious time in my absence; it is greatly appreciated. As a school, and for me personally, the additional support from lan Wilkinson has been a godsend and both he and our Chair of Governors, Steve Houghton, have supported me throughout this time.

Physically I have made really good progress. I am at the gym regularly, going for walks most days, and am probably fitter than before I had my brain haemorrhage. The consultants are delighted with how I am doing but tell me that progress for this happens over months rather than days and weeks. Encouragingly, they are confident that over time I will make a full recovery and I look forward to the time when I can, return to work. I miss Longbenton as I love teaching and my role as headteacher, working with an incredible team of people who are dedicated to making a real difference in the lives of our students.
