Maths Week 2022

Monday November 14th was the start of Maths Week England. In Maths lessons we were able to join some Zoom sessions through The Advanced Maths Support Network. These included "Maths is Everywhere" where we looked at maths in different subjects including Business Studies and Psychology, "The Connected World" where we saw how we are connected to other people across the world and "Which Career". Some classes also watched some of the Gresham lecture on "Where do Mathematical symbols come from?" and attempted writing numbers in Egyptian and Greek. We also looked at lots of different puzzles in lessons which tested the students' problem solving skills.

Students were also able to take part in a treasure hunt around the school; each teacher had a number on their lanyard and students had to identify a teacher who had a square, cube, even number etc. and some lucky students won some chocolate. Staff also had the opportunity to try some maths puzzles themselves.

In the run up to Christmas the Maths Department will also be taking part in the GCHQ Christmas Challenge. In the New Year we will be entering the Intermediate Maths Challenge.



Eco-Schools Green Flag Status

We are proud to announce that Longdendale High School have been awarded Eco-Schools Green Flag Status. This is an internationally recognised award for excellence in environmental action and learning.

The Eco-Schools programme provides a unique opportunity that empowers young people to lead change within their school and have a positive impact on their wider community. The programme encourages students to work together to develop their environmental knowledge and awareness.

Our Eco Club, founded in September 2021, worked hard throughout the last academic year to improve the impact the school has on the environment.

Finally, huge congratulations go to Eve in Year 7 who came 4th in the Under 12 girls and is now through to the Greater Manchester Championships.



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
Football Round-up
